

This property has two identical semi detached buildings. Each painted brick building is separated by a parapet wall and has a gambrel corrugated iron roof to the rear with a separate gable to the front. The gable end has roughcast and timber infill. Below the gable a separate verandah roof joins to the central parapet wall at the centre and is hipped at each end. The verandah is supported on turned double half timber posts on brick columns. The verandah has a decorative timber arched frieze. Entry doors are situated each side of the dividing parapet wall and there is a french door with glassed surround to the verandah.

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
