This house is set high above the street level. Below the ground floor, an undercroft houses a double garage with roller doors. The house has a gambrel roof with a separate gable to the front (west). There are finials to the apex of the gable and gables. The gable end is enclosed with fibro and timber batten, fibro plank has been used below with a comugated iron awning to the window. The north side of the gable extends to form a verandah roof. Adjacent to the verandah is a pergola with shade cloth to the roof and sides. The verandah and pergola are supported on turned timber posts, with a balustrade to the north and west. There are three tall rendered corbelled chimneys to the main roof.

Although the walls have been replaced, the place still retains most of its original form and decorative elements such as the tall corbelled chimneys, decorative gable end, finials and turned timber verandah posts. As such the place makes a high contribution to the streetscape of the area.

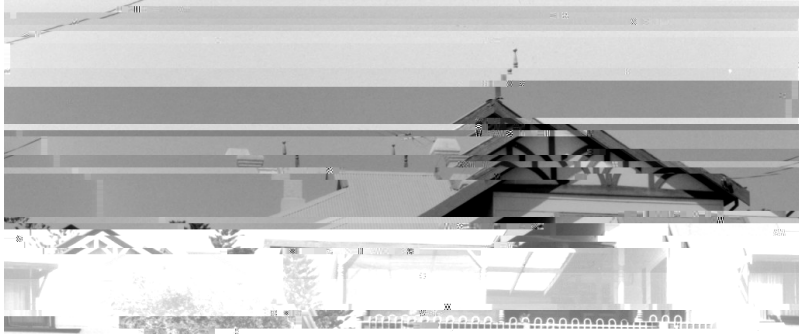
