The front (west) elevation still reveals the building's use as a shop, there being two large display windows. The roof is punctuated by a corbelled brick chimney to the south.

In the Geraldton Express 20/09/1926 there is a photograph of the store, then operated by R. Martin. Martin disposed of his business at Walkaway in 1932.
