The main house at Crauden Park is of stone construction with a hipped comugated iron roof with gablets. The roof extends to cover surrounding verandahs which are partly enclosed to provide for additional living space. The verandahs are supported on masonry columns. To the rear of the house (east) is a stone outbuilding which could have accommodated the kitchen. The place has a comugated iron gable roof which is punctuated by a simple rendered chimney. The walls have been whitewashed. Immediately to the north is a small stone worker's cottage which features brick quoining to openings and a cut stone as a key stone. Adjacent are two toilets, one of stone and the other of brick construction.

The title to VL 1478 was taken up by C. Sims in 1886 for £62.10.0 (the plan shows an existing stone house). It was mortgaged by C. Sims to Francis Pearse, Merchant, Dongara in 1888 to secure a sum of £400. The property was transferred to Charles William Sims in 1892, and then to Francis Pearse in 1900. In 1904 the property was owned by Pearse and occupied by Henry Rumble. The next owner, in 1922 was Fanny Priscilla Mitchell. Joseph Rumble purchased the property c 1923. In 1932, ownership was

transferred to Manford Rumble and Ernest John Rumble. Don and Anne Moffat purchased the property in 1977. (Source: Gary Martin)

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Crauden Park has some historic significance as evidence of the settlement patterns of the Greenough District. The outbuildings are of particular significance as they are characteristic of the simple style and construction techniques employed on local buildings of the c 1880s.

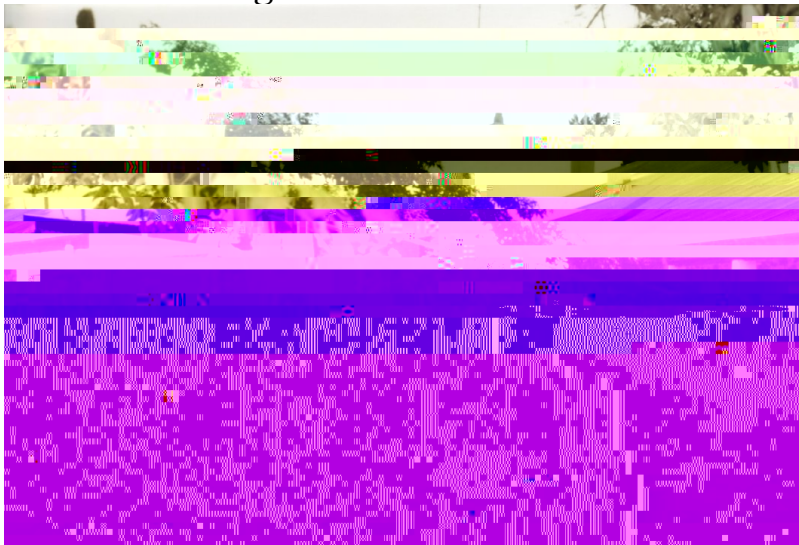
