Minnenooka Homestead dates from the late 1800's. The house has been added to over the years with an extra wing off the rear forming an 'L' shaped plan overall. The external walls generally are dark sandstone and the original roof has been replaced by green aluminium tiles. The large perimeter verandahs have been concreted and pipe columns replace the original timber posts. The interiors have been completely 'modernised' in the 1960-1970's and reflect little of the original character of the place. Minnenooka, or Minninooka as it is also known, is believed to mean 'anthill' in the local Aboriginal dialect. The property was originally part of the larger land holdings owned by the Pastoral Company which was associated with well known names such as the du Boulay, Logue, Walcott and Menzies. The title to VL 73 was taken up by du Boulay & Menzies in 1857. A.H. and Mrs du Boulay established their home at Minnenooka. The Homestead was built in 1879. The property was owned by Thomas Readhead c 1904-14.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Minnenooka Homestead is historically significant for its role in the early pastoral development of the region and for its association with well known identities in the district. Although its aesthetic significance is considerably diminished by the major renovations that have changed the character of the place, some elements of the original fabric remain intact, as is particularly evident in the outbuildings. As such the place remains an important part of the historic character of the Shire.
