

The Bowtell Building comprises a row of six shops facing Maitland Road, with a shadowline clad verandah to the street kerb, supported on steel poles. Above the verandah there is a parapet wall extending approximately 1.5 metres high, utilised for signage. The cmer with Stock Road is angled, with the verandah extending around the comer. A triangular pediment rises above the parapet at the comer, bearing the date of construction. A mural depicting an ANZAC scene of soldiers silouhetted against a sunrise is painted on the western wall of the building addressing the nearby war memorial. At the time of the assessment the shops were all empty with roller shutters obscuring the glazing to the shop fronts.
