The main entrance to the Mullewa Swimming Pool Complex is off Jose Street, via an amenity building which leads into a large fenced and lawned area containing the main pool and toddler wading pool. There are shade sails over the toddler pool and play equipment adjacent on the lawned area. The amenity building has a flat metal deck roof and brick walls which have been clad with sheeting and painted in late 2011 to obscure all the face brickwork.
